PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

The past few months have been full of activity so to be brief, I'll jump right to the news impacting MPNA our surrounding community:

City of San Antonio Vacant Building Ordinance (VBO): MPNA supported the Office of Historic Preservation's VBO pilot program ordinance which was approved on June 19, 2014 by City Council. The VBO's direct impact to MPNA and surrounding community: all vacant buildings with the Monticello Park Historic District and landmarks within the greater community will have to register with the City of San Antonio and be inspected annually. Can some vacant buildings be exempt?: Yes, Single family residential buildings that meet the standard of care are exempt from the program. The requirement to register within 90 days may be extended for properties listed for sale or lease at fair market value. The VBO establishes a minimum standard of care and upkeep and penalties for violation. Registration fee: \$250 for a single-family residences and \$750 for all other structures. In addition, an annual inspection fee of \$0.01 per square foot (\$50 minimum) will be charged.

Opening new Woodlawn Lake Bridge: Just in the nick of time.....the new vehicular bridge and W. Woodlawn opened late on July 3, 2014 in anticipation of the 4th of July events at Woodlawn Lake.

Groundbreaking of the new Wal-Mart: The new store will be located near the intersection of Woodlawn and Bandera. It has brought life back into an area where development was stagnant after the anchor store, Kroger, closed its doors many years ago.

<u>The Restaurant Depot Renovations</u>: Expansion is underway on 3 sides of the building to bring added floor space within the store, refrigeration and new loading docks. Estimated date of completion: September 2015.

4th of July Children's Parade: Much thanks to all the volunteers from MPNA for assisting with a successful event! Special thanks to Richard Weik for making 200 patriotic crowns (halos)!!! There were over 400 children who showcased their patriotic spirit.


Oh! and the okra for all you brave souls who


